


JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW **CHANGES & REMINDERS**

I. JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SHOW

A General

- Entry deadline: November 15, 2022.
- Livestock Premium List and Entry Applications will be available at FWSSR.COM on September 15.
- · Please fill out Entry Applications completely including appropriate signatures prior to submitting entries.
- . Entry applications are legal, binding documents. An exhibitor who makes a material misrepresentation subjects themselves to being barred from all further competition.
- · Residue Avoidance Program remains in effect.
- · All entries in the Junior Livestock Show must be exhibited by the owner/exhibitor, except when the exhibitor has more than one entry in a class or cannot be present to show their own animal due to circumstances beyond their control. In these cases, a substitute showman may exhibit the animal provided that the substitute showman meets all Junior Exhibitor criteria and is approved by the Superintendent of that department. A substitute showman may not exhibit animals for an owner/exhibitor participating in other events or activities (UIL competitions, school sports, etc.) or just being absent from the competition. If the exhibitor is scholastically ineligible to participate, as determined by the respective School District, the exhibitor and their entries are ineligible for competition.
- . An animal will be disqualified from the show if it is being trimmed, fitted, or dressed by anyone other than exhibitors. County Extension Agents or Agricultural Science Teachers from the State of Texas, or other feeders or leaders within the county or school district from which the animal is entered.
- · Any Junior animal entry which, when rubbed with a cloth or glove show residual evidence of artificial coloring, will be disqualified.


- TGBA- Texas Goat Breeders Association. Goats placing 5th-10th that were bred by TGBA members with an official & properly recorded TGBA tag will receive a \$1,000 incentive in 2023.
- Beginning in 2024 to be eligible to exhibit in the market goat show, the goats must be bred by a member of the TGBA & have an official TGBA tag in the goat's ear and recorded at time of validation. This does not include wether does at this time.
- Market Lambs may bring a maximum of 3 head No more than 2 per breed
- Gilts must have been farrowed between June 1st September
 15th 2022
- Jr. Breeding Gilts and Stars Gilts will be shown by weight
- Steer show will continue classifying on arrival day
- Heifers will continue with 2 waves: Wave 1- Hereford, Angus, Simmental, Brangus, Beefmaster, Santa Gertrudis, ARB. Wave 2- Shorthorn, Charolais, Chianina, Maine-Anjou, Limousin, Red Angus, ORB, Braunvieh
- Heifer Futurity will bring back showmanship
- Breeding Sheep will continue with 2 waves: Wave 1-Rambouillet, Delaine, Southdown, Hampshire, ORB. Wave 2-Dorper & White Dorper



UPDATES & REMINDERS

I. Junior Show General Information

Junior Show Eutry: Entries are not considered complete unless they have been submitted online <u>and</u> postmarked on or before THURSDAY, December 1, 2022. Incomplete entries (entries either not submitted online or post marked by December 1, 2022) will be assessed an additional 10% fee.

i. Late Entries: For any Junior Show entries submitted online and postmarked from December 2-15, 2022, all standard entry fees will be doubled, if accepted.

ii. Late Entries: For any Junior Show entries postmarked or received from December 16, 2022, until the end of check-in for the respective show or contest, a late entry fee of \$250 per entry will be assessed, if accepted.

Quality Counts: To be eligible to compete in the Junior Breeding, Junior Commercial and/or Junior Market Shows, exhibitors will need Quality Counts verification. The Quality Counts verification number must be recorded on the online entry when entering the project. Please refer to the website https://agrillife.org/qualitycounts/ for information on how to become verified.

Breeding Show Ownership Deadlines:

Registration Certificates will be used to verify ownership date for breeding animals with the exception of Crossbred Gilts, Commercial Ewes and Commercial Does. Animals must be registered in the Herdbook of their Association in only the name of the Junior owner(s) on or before the required ownership date (see below). Registration Certificates must state the name of the Junior owner(s) only. Registration Certificates that list any additional names besides the name(s) the entry is validated under will be disqualified. Registration Certificates must be available upon request.

Putchase, delivery, possession, transfer, and registration must all take place on or before the required ownership date. Original Registration Certificates must be available during the show at all times.

Registered Sheep, Boer Breeding Goat: October 1, 2022 (Must be validated through Breeding Sheep or Breeding Goat Validation, respectively, on or before October 31, 2022) Note* Family validation is now allowed for breeding sheep and goats. Visit www.sheepandgoatvalidation.tamu.edu for complete validation guidelines.

Commercial Ewes, Commercial Does: October 31, 2022 (Must be validated through Breeding Sheep or Breeding Goat Validation, respectively, on or before October 31, 2022)

Angora Breeding Goat, Dairy Heifers, Beef Breeding Heifers: November 1, 2022 (Beef Breeding Heifers must complete all phases of heifer validation through the Texas 4-H & FFA Breeding Heifer Validation Program on or before November 8, 2022)

Breeding Swine, Crossbred Gilts: December 1, 2022 (Must complete all phases of gilt validation through the Texas 4-H & FFA Breeding Gilt Validation Program on or before December 1, 2022)
