





This Strawberry Cucumber Salad is the perfect summer time dish to bring to any BBQ or pot luck! This dish focuses on seasonal produce, bright and refreshing flavors, and really focuses on fiber!

Instructions

FINSION

- 1. Wash your hands and clean your preparation area. Rinse vegetables, fruits and herbs under cool running water before chopping.
- 2.In a large bowl, combine the cucumbers, strawberries, red onion, and basil.
- 3.In a small bowl or jar combine lime juice, olive oil, and honey. Whisk or shake until combined.
- 4. Pour the dressing over the cucumber mixture and toss to combine. Top with feta cheese.

- 3 large Cucumbers skin removed, chopped
- 3 cups strawberries quartered
- 1/2 cup red onion finely chopped
- 1/4 cup basil leaves chopped

DID YOU KNOW...

Storing berries can be kind of tricky and costly if not done properly. In order to get your monies worth with these fragile delicacies, it's important to use a method that will help to sustain their short life span. In the case of berries, timing is everything. These quick and easy tips will help to keep your berries fresher and longer.

Choosing Berries

 Inspect your berries before you put them in the shopping cart – look for mold, mushy spots, leaky packages, discoloration, or berries that are shriveled – all of these are signs that the berries are old or damaged and you shouldn't purchase.

Storing Berries

 Store berries in the refrigerator for longest life and best quality. If your refrigerator has a fruit & vegetable drawer, store them there.

Washing Berries

- Wash berries only just before using or consuming. Washing berries before storing can add excess moisture and promote mold growth.
- Using a colander rinse berries under gentle, cool, running water to remove and dirt or debris.



Choosing, Washing & Storing BERRIES



Freezing Berries

- In most cases berries can be washed, laid in a single layer to dry on a clean surface.
- Option 1: lay berries in a single layer on a cookie sheet and set in the freezer. After a couple of hours, remove berries from the freezer and place in a freezer safe container to be placed back in the freezer. This helps prevent clumping.
- Option 2: place berries in a freezer safe baggie and lay as flat as you can in the freezer to try and prevent clumping.

Texas 4-H Horse Show Rules and Guidelines

The major changes include:

- Ranch Cutting will be added as a class in the stock horse division. This class will not count towards high point in the division. Exhibitors can show in both cutting and ranch cutting. (pg. 87)
- District qualification will be removed; however, for safety reasons, futurity exhibitors must participate in a district horse show, district educational clinic, or other equivalent event where futurity project is present. Participation will be verified by the county extension agent on the State 4-H Horse Show entry form. (pg. 9). This change allows more flexibility for district programs to offer targeted experiences that are tailored to local needs; and allows more flexibility for 4-H families.
- State 4-H Horse Show entries will be open earlier beginning May 1 and will remain open until July 1.
- Ownership requirement amendment: lease horses will be allowed. Official Texas 4-H Horse Lease agreement must be signed by the exhibitor, horse owner, and county extension agent. Lease period must include, at minimum, May 1st to August 31st of the current 4-H Year. The lease form must be uploaded to 4HOnline at validation. (pg. 7)

This is a significant change for horse project eligibility in Texas which the committee expects will result in an increase in participation at the State 4-H Horse Show. However, the anticipated increase in participation at the state show was not the primary goal when considering this change. In fact, the State 4-H Horse Show has seen a 10.7% increase in participation over the past 4 years. The objective in allowing lease horses is to make the show more inclusive for young horse enthusiasts who may not have the opportunity for horse ownership yet.

2023 State Fair of Texas and Heart of Texas - Barrows and Gilts

It feels too soon to be sending this out, but it is time to order tags for all barrow and gilt exhibitors for the 2023 State Fair of Texas and Heart O Texas Shows!

- All barrows, cross gilts and purebred (registered gilts) must be validated to show at the State Fair of Texas and the Heart of Texas Fair.
- Exhibitors must provide a color copy of the registration papers for all registered gilts tagged to your respective Ag Science Teacher or County Extension Agent. Those papers must be uploaded to the swine validation system by August 1, 2023.
- Please, have exhibitors keep a copy of the payment receipt that is emailed to them.
- Tags for this order are \$20. I will send out a link for late orders at a later date and the price will increase to \$23.

This link will close on April 21st.





Whether you have been in a show ring 1 time or 100 times, there is always something new to learn! Hi, I'm Emma Hauprich, one of your Parker Co. 4-H Ambassadors. One of the biggest things you can do while in a show ring is to practice good sportmanship! Here are some showmanship tips that I hope help you this show season!



Always look at the judge! Give them your attention just as much as you are giving your animal. A good rule to follow, 5 second intervals. Spend 5 seconds

watching the judge, then check your animal, check yourself, and repeat.

SPACE! Always give the person beside you some space. If your animal is jumping or moving all around and it's bothering those close to you, it is ok for you to move yourself to the end of a line.

There is nothing worse than a sore loser, except maybe a bad winner! It doesnt matter if you win or lose, but how you handle each that shows your true character. Always shake the hands of the judge and your fellow competitors after each trip in the ring.

Head Up!! Yours and your animals! Show confidence in your abilities and show off that animal! Confidence is KEY!

HOW FUNKY IN YOUR CHICKEN? SHOW BIRDS

I know we have several 4-H families that have backyard birds. 4-H'ers do have the opportunity to show them.

We have added a Show Bird poultry show back to our Lonesome Dove Project show at the end of April, in an effort to help our 4-H families prepare for the County Livestock Show.

It is important that you get your flock Pullorium Typhoid tested if you plan to exhibit your poultry, this is required by the Texas Animal Health Commission. Please don't be deterred by having to have your birds tested. It's low cost, and they come to you. The two testers listed below, I know personally, and they are very passionate about show birds and love the opportunity to share their knowledge with youth.

If you think there's even a chance you'd be interested in showing, get a test scheduled.

What is Marine Engineering?

Marine engineering is extremely related to mechanical engineering; it is a broad field of work that encompasses all aspects related to the equipment (machinery and technology) on board ships, boats, and other ocean and sea vessels. Marine engineers can focus on developing, maintaining, supervising, and renewing technologies such as stroke engines, oil purifiers, RAC equipment, boilers, inner gas generators, pumps or electronics – radars, satellite transmitters and receivers, transponders, circuitry, and many others. Sea going marine engineers, as the name suggests, carry out their activity mostly at sea. If you want to pursue a career in this particular field, keep in mind that entry qualifications are important and directly related to the position you will occupy, as well as to the remuneration and benefits. Personnel with no special qualification can also engage in sea going marine engineering activities, on new entry positions, providing that the employer offers some sort of on-the-job training program. Traditionally, the new entry position is cadet, which requires above five high school qualifications and the completion of the cadet training offers the possibility of receiving a higher degree. The completion of cadetship is mandatory in order to move up the ladder and have the possibility of achieving higher levels of certificates within the next years.

WHAT CAREERS CAN I HAVE?

In Marine Engineering, you can have a career as a Marine technician, Ship Fitter, Watercraft Engineer, Marine Engineering Professor, Marine Engineering Coordinator, Mud Engineer (oil and gas in the ocean), Naval Architect, Naval Engineer, and many more!
