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

Parker County 4-H Parent Leader's Association Scholarship

Eligibility

- 1. The applicant must be an active, enrolled member in Parker County 4-H.
- 2. The applicant must have been an active member in 4-H for the past three consecutive years.
- 3. The applicant must be a graduating high school senior.
- 4. The applicant must plan to attend an accredited institution of higher learning: university, community college, trade school or technical school in the Fall and enroll for a minimum of twelve hours.

Requirements

- One completed application. No partial or incomplete application packets will be accepted. Complete
 applications must be submitted by the deadline set, date and time, by the Parent Leader Association. No
 Exceptions.
- 22-23 4-H Record Book following the 22-23 Record Book Family Guide guidelines. Sections 1-7 only, the story will not be included.
- 3. Final (Sealed) Official High School Transcript.
- 4. FASFA Student Aid Report Summary (We do not need the full SAR report).
- 5. Three letters of recommendation from the following. Letters written by family members will not be accepted. All letters must have a signature as well as the contact information for the individual writing the letter:
 - a. 4-H Leader (Not a County Extension Agent)
 - High School Representative (principal, counselor, teacher). If homeschooled, a co-op teacher or an individual that you have worked with in an education or leadership capacity will be acceptable. (Not a County Extension Agent)
 - c. One person of your choice (Not a County Extension Agent)
- 6. Resume Up to 2 pages, 10-12 point font.
- 7. One essay, 500-1000 words, addressing one of the following topics:
 - a. Write about a time that you failed at something. How did that failure affect you? or
 - b. Describe a favorite book where the main character has to decide something difficult. What did you think about their choice?
- 8. Club or project leader to verify attendance of applicant's club or project meeting via Google Form.
- 9. Application must be endorsed by a current Parker County Extension Agent.

Scholarship

A submitted application and interview do not guarantee a scholarship. Once awarded, scholarships are issued with proof of enrollment to an institution of higher learning.

The judging committee will consist of two Parker County 4-H Parent Leader Association officers and one outside individual selected with advice from a Parker County Extension Agent and/or the Parker County 4-H Administrative Assistant.

The goal of the Parker County Leaders Association is to provide as many scholarships as possible to eligible seniors; however, depending on the number of seniors and the balance of the account, this goal may not always be met. The committee may not award all the money if a large sum has been accumulated. Not all applicants will receive a scholarship. Awards will be based on eligibility, interview and most importantly funding raised for the award year.



The Gold Star Award is the highest county achievement award and intended to be received only once in a member's 4-H career. Counties have award quotas based on the number of senior 4-H members. The following requirements must be met:

The member must be at least 15 years of age as of September 1st of the 4-H year in which he or she is to be considered for the award and must have completed at least 3 years in 4-H including the current year.

The 4-H member must submit an awards program record book in the year he or she is to be considered for the awards.

The 4-H member must have completed projects in three different project areas, including submission of appropriate record forms, and have participated in one or more activities in at least three of the following areas:

Educational Presentations Projects Camps Citizenship Activities

22–23 GOLD STAR APPLICATION

Project Exhibits Leadership Labs

Public Relations (speeches, poster displays, radio, TV, newspapers, etc.) Other (exchange programs, fundraising, State and National Congress, etc)

Note: It is not expected that the requirements for projects and activities all be completed in the current year. They may have been accomplished over the entire period of time the 4-Her has been in the program.

The member must have exhibited leadership skills by serving as a 4-H officer or committee chairman (club, county, district or state), and/or as a junior or teen leader in an activity or project with or under the supervision of an adult volunteer leader. The 4-H member must have participated in one or more community service activities. 

Parmesan Pasta Chips

APRIL 28, 2023 BY DINNER TONIGHT

If you're looking for a delicious, easy, on-the-go snack, then our Parmesan Pasta Chips are just for you! With their crunch and cheese flavor these pasta chips are sure to be all the rave!

Instructions

- 1. Clean and prep cooking area.
- 2. Cook pasta according to the packaging.
- 3. Once pasta is cooked, drain it, and set it aside.
- 4. To a large mixing bowl, add your cooked pasta, olive oil, parmesan cheese (1 Tbsp), minced garlic, garlic powder (½ tsp), onion powder, cayenne pepper, and Italian seasoning. Mix until well combined.
- 5. Air Fryer: If you are using an air fryer, add pasta to basket and cook at 375 degrees for 15 minutes or until crunchy. Mix pasta every 3-5 minutes for the first 10 minutes and every minute thereafter during cooking time to avoid burning. Oven: If you are using an oven, pre heat oven to 400 degrees and cook pasta chips for 15- 25 minutes or until crunchy. Mix every 3-5 minutes to allow even baking.
- 6. Once pasta chips are done, mix with the remaining parmesan cheese and garlic powder and top with red pepper flakes and parsley.
- 7. Serve with ¼ cup of marinara sauce (per serving) to dip and enjoy!

- 1.5 Cup dry pasta rigatoni
- 1 Tbsp olive oil
- 2 Tbsp grated Parmesan cheese divided
- 1 Tsp minced garlic
- 1 Tsp garlic powder divided
- 1/2 Tsp onion powder
- 1/4 Tsp cayenne pepper
- 1/2 Tsp Italian seasoning
- 1/4 Tsp red pepper flakes
- 1/2 Tsp parsley dried
- 1/2 Cup traditional marinara sauce No added sugar options

Texas 4-H Horse Show Rules and Guidelines

The major changes include:

- Ranch Cutting will be added as a class in the stock horse division. This class will not count towards high point in the division. Exhibitors can show in both cutting and ranch cutting. (pg. 87)
- District qualification will be removed; however, for safety reasons, futurity exhibitors must participate in a district horse show, district educational clinic, or other equivalent event where futurity project is present. Participation will be verified by the county extension agent on the State 4-H Horse Show entry form. (pg. 9). This change allows more flexibility for district programs to offer targeted experiences that are tailored to local needs; and allows more flexibility for 4-H families.
- State 4-H Horse Show entries will be open earlier beginning May 1 and will remain open until July 1.
- Ownership requirement amendment: lease horses will be allowed. Official Texas 4-H Horse Lease agreement must be signed by the exhibitor, horse owner, and county extension agent. Lease period must include, at minimum, May 1st to August 31st of the current 4-H Year. The lease form must be uploaded to 4HOnline at validation. (pg. 7)

This is a significant change for horse project eligibility in Texas which the committee expects will result in an increase in participation at the State 4-H Horse Show. However, the anticipated increase in participation at the state show was not the primary goal when considering this change. In fact, the State 4-H Horse Show has seen a 10.7% increase in participation over the past 4 years. The objective in allowing lease horses is to make the show more inclusive for young horse enthusiasts who may not have the opportunity for horse ownership yet.

2023 STATE FAIR AND HEART OF TEXAS TAG ORDERS – SWINE

2023 State Fair of Texas and Heart of Texas - Barrows and Gilts

It feels too soon to be sending this out, but it is time to order tags for all barrow and gilt exhibitors for the 2023 State Fair of Texas and Heart O Texas Shows!

- All barrows, cross gilts and purebred (registered gilts) must be validated to show at the State Fair of Texas and the Heart of Texas Fair.
- Exhibitors must provide a color copy of the registration papers for all registered gilts tagged to your respective Ag Science Teacher or County Extension Agent. Those papers must be uploaded to the swine validation system by August 1, 2023.
- Please, have exhibitors keep a copy of the payment receipt that is emailed to them.
- Tags for this order are \$20. I will send out a link for late orders at a later date and the price will increase to \$23.

This link will close on May 30th.



MAJOR STOCK SHOW TAG ORDERS – HEIFERS/STEERS

2023-2024 Major Stock Show Steer/Heifer Tag Orders - Due June 5, 2023 (click link below to order)

- **NEW** FOR 2023 both steers and heifers will be charged \$25 (We, Parker Co., charge an additional \$3 to cover the online payment system, postage and validation supplies) per validation fee. This increase in cost is due to two factors we are facing this year. 1) In an effort to be in compliance with Texas Animal Health Commission, we are switching our previous EID frequency tags to 840 frequency EID tags. This will allow our state validated livestock to move in compliance with TAHC across state lines and be in compliance when issues a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health papers). This is a move in a positive direction, but does come at an increased cost. 2) Costs and fees have increased across the board, as well as expanding the services of the validation program to additional shows. That said, we must compensate accordingly to continue to provide educators, exhibitors, and their families the continued support, education, and consistency we have established. Please keep in mind the validation fee is not ONLY for the cost of the tag, but the entire validation SYSTEM that includes personnel, travel to livestock shows, a robust online database/maintenance, and our validation compliance team that helps ensure our rules and guidelines are enforced to ensure a fair and level playing field for Texas livestock exhibitors.
- ****NEW** FOR 2023** all state validated heifers will be tagged similar to steers. This will bring our heifer validation program in line with breeding sheep, breeding goats, and breeding gilts.
- Heifers that are already validated and have not changed breed or ownership, do not need to be revalidated with a tag. Only newly validated heifers will get a tag and will be charged the new validation fee. As always, if a heifer changes ownership or breed, they must be revalidated.
- NOTE: Once validated, heifers remain eligible through their show career unless they change breed or ownership. There is no need to re-validate a heifer if breed or ownership is not being changed.
- 23-24 ALL Major Stock Show Steers
- 23-24 Registered Breeding Heifers (another will be offered in October. Unused June tag orders do not carry over to October) 1 exhibitor per animal, color copy of papers required. ***Heifers will now be tagged***
- ***Please note, heifer and steer tags are interchangeable. If you ordered a market steer tag but got a heifer instead you may use it to tag the heifer.



MAJOR STOCK SHOW TAG ORDERS – SHEEP–GOATS 2023-State Fair of Texas Lamb and Goat Tag Orders- Due June 5, 2023

- ***NEW FOR 2023*** Lambs and goats validated during the 2023 State Fair Validation Period WILL BE ELIGIBLE for 2024 Spring Major Shows. Market animals validated for the 2023 State Fair will carryover for 2024 Spring Major Shows. Once validated, the project MUST stay in the care of the exhibitor that project is validated to; if the exhibitor chooses to sell the project to a new exhibitor, the new exhibitor MUST REVALIDATE the project within the next validation period.
- Breeding/commercial lamb and goat requirements for STFR.
 - The State Fair of Texas is requiring validation for registered breeding sheep, registered breeding goats, wether/commercial dams, and wether commercial does.
- Market Lamb May be validated by family (validation will carry over to 2024 spring majors)
- Market Goats May be validated by family (validation will carry over to 2024 spring majors)
- Wether Dams May be validated by family validation good for 3 years unless change of ownership.
- Wether Does May be validated by family validation good for 3 years unless change of ownership.
- Registered Breeding Sheep ***may be family validated if all exhibitors are listed on papers***, color copy of papers required at time of validation - validation good for 3 years unless change of ownership.
- Registered Breeding Boer Goats ***may be family validated all exhibitors must be listed on papers*** color copy of papers required at time of validation - validation good for 3 years unless a change of ownership.
- ***Please note, all sheep and goat tags (market and breeding) are interchangeable. If you ordered a market lamb tag but got a breeding goat instead you may use it to tag the breeding goat.
